IN OUR SCHOOLS

- 1) Informational assemblies
- 2) Inner city school - Suburban school student exchange program
- 3) College student - High school student mentor program
- 4) Education Advisory Council (EAC) at each school to gather ideas/issues, formulate solutions and encourage student involvement (*12 members*)
- 5) Statewide Student Empowerment Council (SEC) from participating schools to guide and assist BYCFF (*12 members*)
- 6) Parents Education Council (PEC) from booster clubs of schools with the highest percentage of participation in BYCFF (*12 members*)
- 7) Guidance Counselor Advisory Board (GCAB) guidance counselors from the schools ranked highest in BYCFF participation (*12 members*)
- 8) Student eligibility for scholarships, computers and awards based on active participation in SEC and EAC councils, school involvement, and community service



COMMUNITY INVOLVE-

Community patrons (Goal: 100,000) who donate \$20 or more per year to fund activities and scholarships for qualifying students.

Ensure that every child has a computer in their home through donations and corporate sponsorships.

Service learning opportunities with community businesses and professionals to increase exposure and students awareness of career choices.



The objectives and activities of the Foundation will be based on input from participants. The one member each from the SEC, PEC and GCAB councils will be on the board. (See #5, #6 & #7)



Input from all participating BYCFF educational communities will be included.

Fundraisers will reach out to the community through academic, entrepreneurial and athletic activities.



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
